Grant Writing Company Hired

On February 15, Trustee Crowley moved forward with hiring Administrative Consulting Specialists, LLC (ACS) to identify and write grants for the Village. This is the company that was able to secure the The Justice Department's Hiring Grant! **The grant will cover the hiring of 3 Fulltime Officers for 3 years, which means the Village will see a savings of \$500,000.00 over 3 years.**

Switch Upgrade

Trustee Burbatt has been working on upgrading the Village switches. The Village is the process of switching to Meraki network equipment. Meraki is a cloud-based product that uses a web-based console that is far easier to work with than other products. When Meraki is used for all components the amount of information available about your network and what is connected must be seen to be believed. This all results in a network that can be configured, secured, optimized and maintained far better than any other. Almost all tasks can be done by a single person from a remote location which means tons of information to use for troubleshooting and no running around to solve problems.

Arrest Made

On October 5th, 2022, at approximately 1:52pm, Midlothian Officers were dispatched to 147th Street and Waverly Avenue for a report of shots fired. Upon arrival, Officers learned the offender attempted to carjack the victim. The offender and victim exchanged gunfire during the incident. Midlothian Police Detectives immediately began a thorough investigation of the incident. Through the course of the investigation, Detectives learned that the offender contacted the victim via social media and expressed interest in purchasing a vehicle, the victim had listed for sale. The victim agreed to meet the offender at 147th Street and Waverly Avenue, so the offender could view the vehicle for sale. During the interaction, the victim observed the offender reach into his waistband and draw a handgun, in an attempt to hijack the vehicle. The victim, a licensed concealed carry holder, drew his legally owned weapon and exchanged gunfire with the offender. After an extensive investigation, Midlothian Police Detectives determined the offender to be 19-year-old, Jaylon T. O'Neal of Markham, Illinois.

In the early morning hours of February 6th, 2023, Midlothian Police Detectives, with the assistance of the South Suburban Emergency Response Team (SSERT), served a search warrant on the residence of Jaylon T. O'Neal located in the 16500 block of Plymouth Dr. in Markham. Jaylon was taken into custody a short time later, without incident. During an extensive search of the residence, a loaded firearm was recovered.

The Cook County State's Attorney Office was contacted and they reviewed the facts of the case. The State's Attorney Office approved felony charges against Jaylon O'Neal; two counts of Aggravated

Discharge of a Firearm within 1000 feet of a school (a Class X Felony) and two counts of Attempted Aggravated Vehicular Hijacking (a Class 1 Felony).

Thank you to the Midlothian Detectives for their hardwork and dedication to bring a successful resolution to this investigation.

The Village of Midlothian Offers Residents the Following Items to Rent

Animal Traps

Traps are available for residents to rent for up to 2-weeks. There is a deposit fee of \$75 per trap, which is refundable after it has been returned.*

Block Parties/Street Closures/Multi-Residence Events

These events will require a permit request, and a \$10 deposit for barricades, which is refundable after they are returned. Permit requests are available on our website, and at Village Hall.

***A Trap or Barricade Deposit Fee will be refunded in the form of a check that will be mailed to you within 30 days.**

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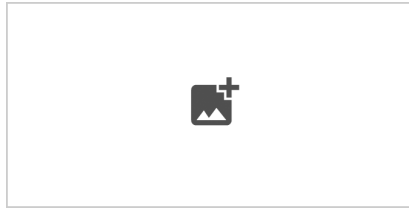


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
